NEW BUSINESS

1. Sister City

Matt Rizzo stated he hopes the City of Creve Coeur would consider entering into a Sister City agreement with Cesson-Sevigne, France, and provided an overview of the program designed to connect cities and people from around the world (see presentation). Mr. Rizzo stated Creve Coeur has many things in common with Cesson-Sevigne, including, but not limited to: population size, demographics, a municipal golf course, Creve Coeur's connection to French-named roads and the city name ("Broken Heart"), Fleur de lis, interest in sports, technology start-up companies, and more. Mr. Rizzo said there is no cost to the City associated with becoming a Sister City and it is an agreement between the mayors of both cities. Mr. Rizzo stated the Mayor of Cesson-Sevigne was approached and is agreeable to setting up a video conference with Mayor Hoffman to discuss the possibility further.

The EDC recommended Mr. Rizzo contact local Creve Coeur schools to inquire as to their level of interest, to which he replied he has contacts with Parkway and Chaminade

4. 39 North Governance

Mark Perkins provided a brief overview of the Joint Work Session of the City Council and Economic Development Committee held in November 2022 to discuss the governance of 39N as presented by Karla Roeber and Emily Lohse-Busch of the Donald Danforth Plant Science Center (see presentation in the agenda packet). Mr. Perkins stated the discussion included 39 North becoming a 501(c)3 nonprofit/

philanthropy agency, hiring personnel, and creating an investment fund to continue the momentum gained from the joint marketing plan from the past five years. Mr. Perkins stated the plans include approaching anchor agencies, including the City of Creve Coeur, to provide start-up funding and serve as founding board members to assist in establishing the structure and governance and he anticipates a formal request to be submitted to the City in the coming months.

Ned Maniscalco asked if the City of Creve Coeur's participation included a direct cash contribution or a tax abatement, to which Mr. Perkins stated both would be on the table at some point.

EDC members suggested it would be helpful if the City contacted other cities that have already developed a similar kind of district to learn about their experiences and if they faced any challenges during the process, and they also inquired as to the role the EDC would play, to which Mr. Perkins said there may be opportunities for EDC members to serve on ad hoc or other advisory committees associated with 39 North as it is further developed.

EDC Members asked how much control the City has over the 90 acres recently sold by Bayer in 39N, to which Mr. Perkins replied the City has a significant amount of control regarding any rezoning for the area for mixed use.

5. Development Update

Jason Jaggi provided a development update, including:

Chic-fil-A: a traffic study was completed with recommendations to adjust street light timing, eliminate an island, and install a turn lane at Tempo and Olive Boulevard. The item is slated to be continued tonight and moved to the February 6, 2023 Planning & Zoning Commission meeting.

Recreational Marijuana: with the passage of adult-use recreational marijuana by Missouri voters, the City code requires updates to allow it as a permissible use in certain areas. Mr. Jaggi stated he anticipates the two medical marijuana facilities will apply for recreational marijuana licenses/zoning in the near future.

6. QuikTrip

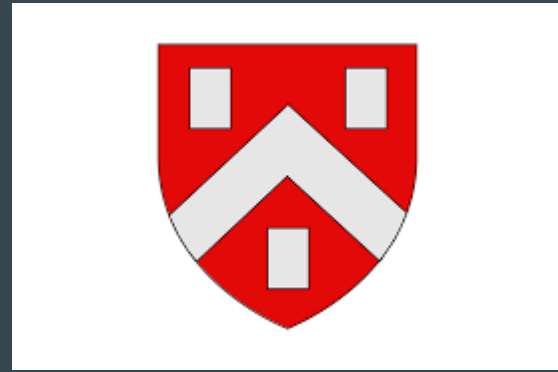

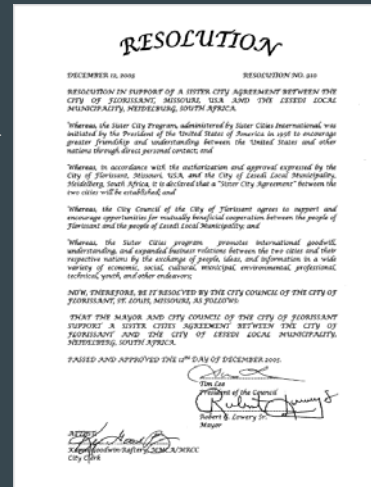

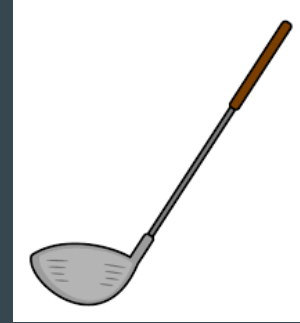

- EDC has its bimonthly meeting in March to review the nominations and vote on its recommendations.
 - EDC prepares a memo to the City Council recommending award recipients no later than April 17; City Council votes on recommendation at the 2nd City Council meeting in April.
- Award ceremony is held at the Creve Coeur-Olivette Chamber of Commerce business luncheon meeting in May. Generally, Mayor or appointee, Chair of EDC or appointee, and staff attend:

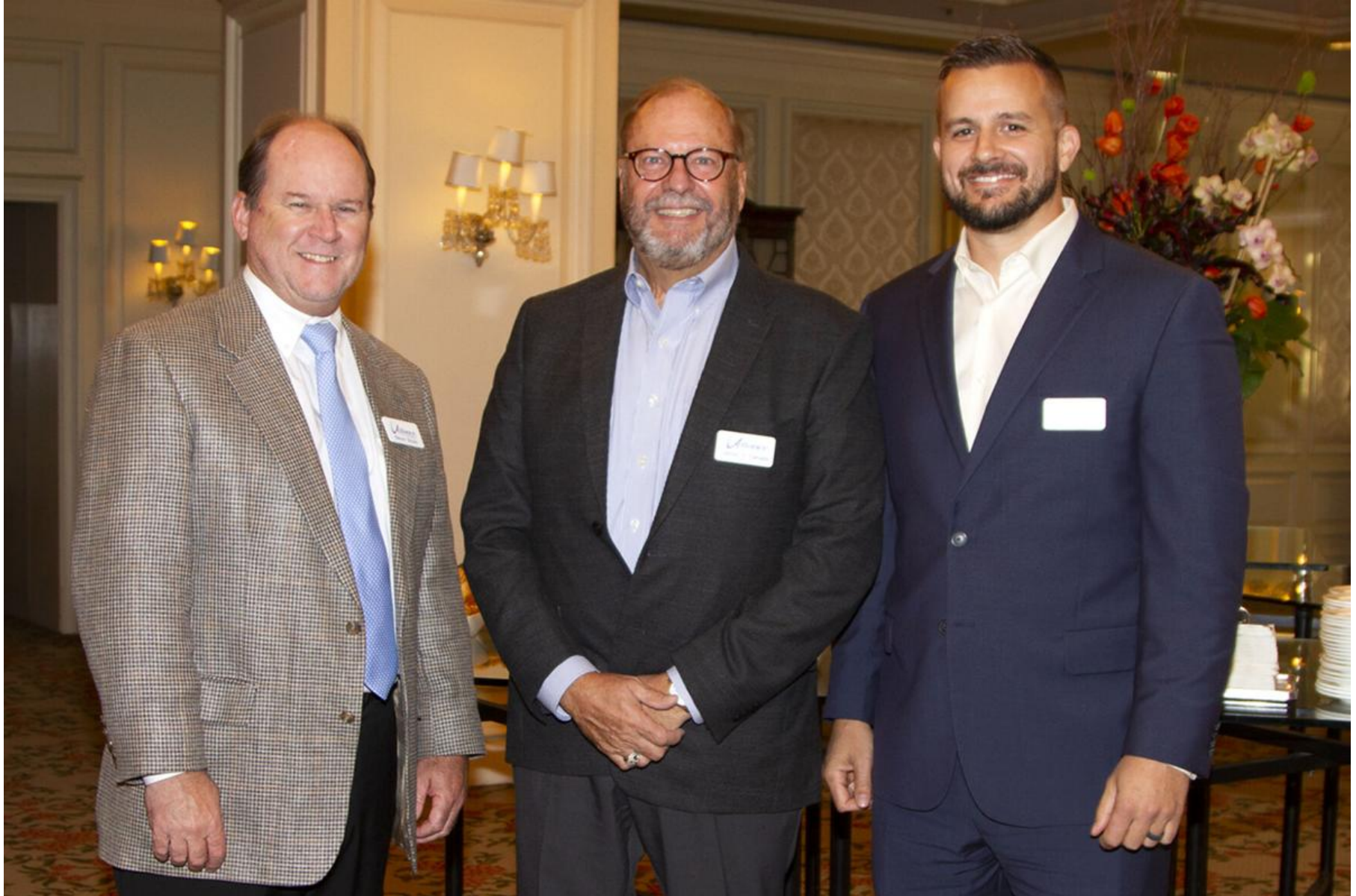

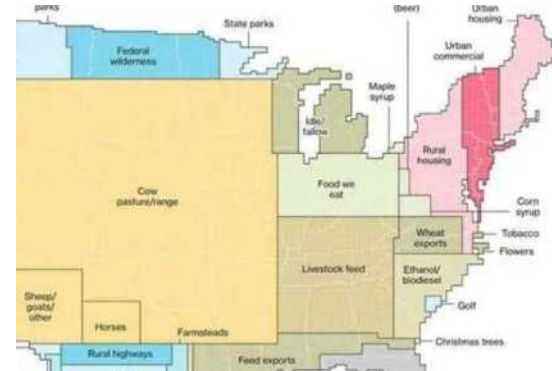

Review: Thai Nivas Café in Creve Coeur

A steady stream of regulars pours into Thai Nivas Café in Creve Coeur every day. The warm, wood-paneled dining room is abuzz with a business lunch crowd, busy servers, a phone ringing with carryout orders and, like a maestro with eyes locked on the score, a sushi chef meticulously slicing rolls in his open prep area. The side-by-side Thai and Japanese menus provide unique options along with all the standards, which are executed exceptionally.

Tom Yum Soup

Lemongrass mingled with a healthy dose of fish sauce sets the tone for this hot and sour soup. I added the chicken (tofu and shrimp are also available), which made a nice combination with the generous bowl of bright red broth teeming with thick-cut mushrooms, green onion slivers and chopped cilantro.

Combo Maki Lunch Special

Made to order in front of you, the sushi at Thai Nivas is killer. The combo maki lunch special includes a warm, crispy, creamy shrimp tempura roll. Better still was the bigger spicy yellowtail roll, which came with avocado and cucumber laced with bright orange smelt eggs and drizzled with a rich, spicy aioli. Along with the sushi, the special came with a bowl of satisfying miso soup bobbing with hunks of tofu and a side salad bathed in ginger dressing.

Pad Peanut Sauce Noodles

If you can polish off an entire order of these noodles, you'll likely hate yourself, but the journey there will be absolutely fantastic. An enormous mound of soft, thin rice noodles is coated with decadent peanut sauce. The chicken option went exceptionally well with this one, combined with stir-fried carrot, sweet bell pepper, onion and little bits of scrambled egg that cling to each bite.

Ma-Sa-Man Curry

This blissful dish delivers tender bits of chicken in a rich red curry sauce with a sweet coconut milk base. Hunks of potato add heft along with softened white onion and a heavy addition of crushed peanuts, which bring a satisfying crunch to the sauce. It's served with a heap of white rice to soak up the curry.

Basil Stir-Fry

This was a lovable take on standard Thai stir-fry. Flavors of fresh basil permeate the dish, and the medium heat option offers just enough spice not to overwhelm the senses. I chose to add pork, succulent and generously portioned, to the thick cuts of white onion and red and green bell pepper.

The Downside

I expected a lot more from the *bamee moo dang*, a hearty noodle soup dish off of the Thai special menu. There was nothing special at all about the dull mass of yellow egg noodles and the bland slices of "barbecue" pork, which failed to be rescued by the broth.

Citizens to Vote on Proposition M on Tuesday, April 4

Creve Coeur Proposition M

On April 4, 2023, Creve Coeur citizens will vote on Proposition M, an additional 3% sales tax on adult use (recreational) marijuana. If approved by a majority of voters, the sales tax revenue will be dedicated to supporting public safety in Creve Coeur. Medical marijuana is exempt from the proposed tax.

Proposed language for Proposition M

Shall the City of Creve Coeur be authorized to impose an additional sales tax for the limited purpose of public safety in an amount not to exceed three percent on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use marijuana sold in the City?

Fast Facts About Creve Coeur's Proposition M

-  Imposes an additional 3% sales tax on adult use (recreational) marijuana.
-  Revenue will be dedicated to public safety in Creve Coeur.
-  Applies to dispensaries in Creve Coeur only. Two dispensaries are currently located in Creve Coeur.
-  Does not apply to medical marijuana.
-  The 3% sales tax on adult use marijuana would be in addition to the 6% state tax on recreational marijuana and all other applicable sales tax in place.
