2. Newsletter Articles

Melissa Bradford stated the next newsletter article will be Tarab Kumar's revised article on using plants as pest repellents in gardens.

Donna Spence suggested educating residents on the benefits of 3000K outdoor lighting (vs 4000K). Donna referred to an item under review by the City Council regarding parking lot lighting at LifeTime Fitness, stating she would like to see 3000K used in their parking lot because the site is surrounded by residential lots. Committee members agreed 3000K would be more beneficial, as research shows that lights greater than 3000K can negatively impact environmental and human health, such as negatively

affecting bird migration and people's sleep cycles.

6. Staff Report: Dielmann Recreation Complex Roof Replacement

Jason Valvero, Director of Recreation, provided information about an upcoming project to replace the Dielmann Recreation Complex roof. The City is going out for bid for a new roof made of either asphalt or metal. The cost to take down and reinstall the existing solar panel system would be approximately \$50,000 dollars, which would wipe out any savings from the solar panels for their remaining lifespan. A metal roof would have a longer lifespan than asphalt. Saranya Konala stated she has had a good experience with her metal roof and solar panels at home, with no leaks. The City may also consider pursuing a new expanded solar grid with a 30-year lifespan, with payback in 15-20 years. The results of the bids will determine which option is financially best, which will be shared with the committee.

3. Climate Action Report

Saranya Konala stated she looked over the website. It needs to be updated with recent city progress and cleaned up to remove broken links. Donna Spence recommended including the Green Business Program and the CAP Phase 3 in future resident and business newsletters.

Melissa Bradford stated the City Council will plan on having a joint work session with the committee in June. Members stated either date in June works for them.

4. Arbor Day - Sunday, April 27, 2025

Melissa Bradford stated she can print any handouts needed for the event. Saranya Konala suggested having ideas for environmentally friendly actions written on pieces of paper for people to draw from a bowl. Donna Spence suggested having a poster board with recyclables / non-recyclables taped to the board. Melissa Bradford stated she would buy candy to give away at the event.
