39N Update

Ms. Wilding stated the City of Creve Coeur continues to be a strong supporter of the 39N plan. She added the City's grant-funded improvements along the Olive/Lindberg interchange and Old Olive Street Road will be beneficial in attracting amenity businesses to foster a sense of community in 39N.

5. Unfinished Business

Vice-Chair Nomination

Chair Ned Maniscalco stated former EDC member Julie LaBonte was appointed to the Planning and Zoning Commission in July leaving the position of Vice-Chair vacant, and he nominated David Morris as Vice-Chair.

No other nominations were received.

Roger Levy moved, seconded by Danielle Finley to nominate David Morris to serve as Vice-Chair for fiscal year 2022. The vote on the motion being 6 ayes and 0 nays, motion carried.

6. Business from Members

No items were brought up for discussion.

7. Business from Staff

A. Building Permit Task Force Recommendations

Mr. Perkins stated the Building Permit Task Force finalized recommendations and presented them to City Council at the November 8, 2021 meeting. He thanked Ned Maniscalco and Council Member Mark Manlin for serving as members. Mr. Perkins added the Building Permit Task Force recommended amendments to the building code to more closely align with St. Louis County and the 2015 International Residential Code. Other recommendations included acquiring software for online permit applications, consolidating inspections for some small home renovation projects, allowing a limited number of re-inspections at no charge, and improving customer service and communication with contractors. Mr. Perkins stated the new Chief Building Official Gregory Tate is doing a good job in implementing many of the recommendations and progress updates will be revisited in the future.

Mr. Maniscalco stated the building permit process is a gateway to economic development in a city.

Council Member Manlin stated the Task Force spent a lot of time discussing public perception of the building division and how it impacts developers wanting to work in Creve Coeur.

Danielle Finley stated the St. Louis Realtors Group has plans to draft a uniform building code for cities to consider adopting so St. Louis area cities are more cohesive and not operating from 40 different building codes. Ms. Finley also stated the St. Louis Realtors will also be hosting meetings with developers and cities to discuss the matter, to which Mr. Perkins said he would like to be invited.

B. Development Updates

Director of Community Development Jason Jaggi provided a brief development update:

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- A 20-unit apartment complex located at 10809 Olive Boulevard is under construction.
- Mercy Hospital located on Ballas Road had a shell and core permit issued.
- Vantage Credit Union located at 611 N. Lindberg Boulevard has submitted permit drawings.
- Spoele Elementary located at 425 N. Spoele Road has had footings poured for a new school.
- Benson Hill located at 1200 Research Boulevard has partial temporary occupancy.

C. Business Awards 2022

Assistant City Administrator Sharon Stott stated promotion for the 2022 Business Awards nomination process commences December 1, 2021 and will continue through to the nomination deadline of March 1, 2022. The Creve Coeur Business Awards will be presented at the Creve Coeur-Olivette Chamber of Commerce membership meeting on Thursday, May 19, 2022 at the Holiday Inn-St. Louis located in Creve Coeur.

Sustainability Practice #1 - Recycle Waste / Composting Service

Benson Hill utilizes Republic Services for recycling. No contamination was visible during inspection. Throughout the facility, there are recycling bins, signage, etc. to ensure recycling program is effective. Benson Hill utilizes Total Organics Recycling for organics collection. The scrap is collected on a regular schedule. Composting the organics from the store diverts food waste from the landfill and lowers the Benson Hill's cost of waste removal. The use of Styrofoam has been phased out except for necessary vendors that require for shipping of specialized products. This Styrofoam is stored and either returned to the shipper or taken to local recycling on a regular basis. Example of the break rooms that include several sustainable measures



such as reusable drinkware, utensils, access to and clear signage for trash, recycling, and compost.

Sustainability Practice #2 - Energy Efficient Facility

Primarily use high-efficiency lighting (e.g., LED, natural light) : The building in which Benson Hill is located (A portion of Floor 2, all of Floors 3 and 4) was constructed in 2020 and is operated to be energy efficient. The building contains 100% LED, motion sensor activation, etc. The HVAC has 5 zones and is automated by scheduled operations to reduce energy usage. Facility restrooms contain water efficient faucets and toilets

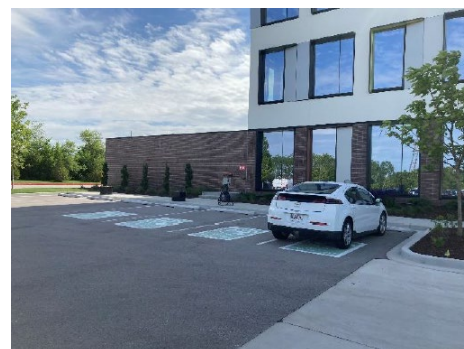
Sustainability Practice #3 - Established Green Team

The Director of ESG & Impact, along with the Environmental, Health, and Safety Manager leads the company's established Green Team. The Green Team actively looks for ways to decrease waste and educate employees on best practices through a variety of initiatives such as lunch and learn events, composting, volunteering opportunities and increased signage. They recently sponsored a #BHEarthWeek to empower team members to continue to connect around climate action and ways to build a better future together. The weeklong celebration featured a theme for each day:

1. Monday, April 19-Community Outreach
2. Tuesday, April 20-Green Food
3. Wednesday, April 21-Reduce and Reuse
4. Thursday, April 22-Eco-friendly Living & EARTH DAY
5. Friday, April 23-Sustainable & Local Shopping

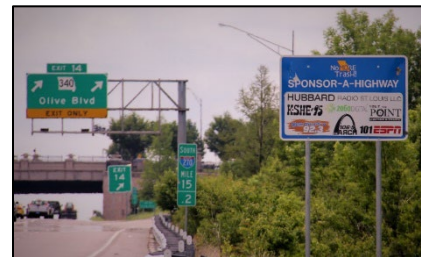

Sustainability Practice #1 - Dedicated Staff for Sustainability Initiatives

In 2018, Hubbard assigned Tim Elwell to oversee sustainability efforts for the company. His title is Promotions Coordinator and Sustainability Manager. He has successfully

implemented several green practices. Tim has incorporated Staff education for the 100+ employees on how to be environmentally friendly including the following:

- Establishing a St Louis Green Team with members from various stations and departments. The team has diversity with race, gender and age and meets to discuss current initiatives and ideas for the future.
- Green Tip of the Month - In addition to the Green Tip of the Week (posted in the break room when staff is back to full capacity), they include a monthly suggestion on how Hubbard staff can make small changes to improve the environment.
- The Mug Shot Contest encouraged staff to bring reusable drinkware to minimize waste and cut costs of disposable cups. Staff was asked to submit a selfie with their mugs. The random winner received Cardinals tickets, Pasta House Gift Certificates and Concert tickets.
- Initiated a Sponsor-A-Highway Sign that is posted along 270 SB and Olive exit. Hubbard signed a 3-year contract with MODOT to pay for this stretch to be cleaned.
- Partners with Hollywood Casino Amphitheatre to promote Hubbard's message of green initiatives. They also work with the Venue Sustainability Coordinator to see how Hubbard can help with going green at live shows.

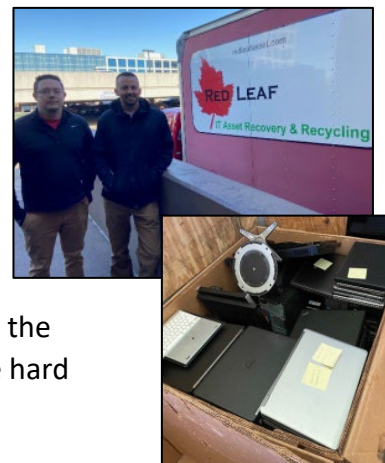


Sustainability Practice #2 - Primarily utilize recyclable/reusable containers and/or packaging

Hubbard has phased out Styrofoam use and utilizes recyclable office products. Plastic utensils are no longer available in the kitchen break room. Recycled paper used for Hubbard envelopes and business cards. Green practices have been implemented throughout business operations, such as double sided printing and digital traffic logs. Hubbard makes efforts to purchase environmentally friendly products. For example, sustainable Microphone Cover. As they pivoted with the pandemic, the engineering department ordered products to protect staff like mic covers to prevent the spread of germs and bacteria. These are biodegradable and environmentally safe.

Sustainability Practice #3 - Recycles Waste

Hubbard has an effective recycling program with Always Green Recycling. There are recycling bins located throughout the office. They have three rolling bins and multiple containers that are emptied once a week. Hubbard worked with Red Leaf Recycling to create an event for staff to recycle unused electronics. They had a great turnout, thanks to the engineers for getting rid of old, outdated items. They received \$1,440 payment to Hubbard for the value of items recycled. In addition to recycling the electronics, they destroyed all pertinent information stored on the hard drives.



Additional Sustainability Practices

Sustainability Coordinator creates a "Future Focus" which includes next steps for Hubbard sustainability practices. For example: Staff awareness campaign focusing on reducing waste; Research environmental improvements for working remotely; Each station to focus on one event to "Go Green" work with Promo Directors; Volunteer Day for staff that focuses on trash pickup or other green activity.

Sustainability Practice #1 - Recycle Waste

Crushed Red utilizes Always Green recycling services to recycle waste. No contamination was present at time of inspection. The restaurant is designed to generate little to no waste. Recycling receptacles are located throughout the restaurant. Staff is educated on importance of recycling.

Sustainability Practice #2 - Primarily utilize recyclable/reusable containers and/or packaging

Crushed Red utilizes many methods for reducing waste, such as the following: biodegradable and compostable tableware, paper products, to-go packaging; glass beverage cups, (no plastic cups); dining room linens, instead of disposable napkins

Sustainability Practice #3 - Composting Services

Crushed Red utilizes local Total Organics Recycling for food scrap collection. The scrap is collected on a regular schedule. Composting the food scraps diverts food waste from the landfill and lowers the Crushed Red's trash costs. Crushed Red is part of the Green Dining Alliance. We were given this distinction after our locations went through a comprehensive analysis and it was determined that we exceed industry norms for

sustainable restaurant management & operations. We are proud that our restaurants produce little-to-no waste and maintain sustainable operations. This has been very important to us from the beginning and we feel it's also very important to our guests.

Additional Sustainability Practices:

- Use of high efficiency appliances: Many of the restaurant's appliances are energy star
