3. Unfinished Business

A. Project Ideas

i. Artistic Bus Shelter

Lisa Hilton provided an update on her research into partnering with St. Louis Metro (Bi-State Development Agency of the Missouri-Illinois Metropolitan District) to establish artistic bus shelters. St. Louis Metro is supportive of upgrading bus shelters and noted that it is better to focus on bus stops on the south side of Olive as the bus route usually travels west to east, and there is not much ridership on Lindbergh. For the stops that already have shelters, you could for example change out the panels and put in etched glass.

Robert Morrissey asked why the Arts Committee was pursuing bus shelters. Lisa Hilton stated that the City Council has a goal to add more covered bus shelters to existing bus stops, and the Arts Committee could coordinate ahead of time to encourage the bus shelters have an artistic design.

Robert Morrissey stated that the existing bus shelter models are sleek, easy to see, and do not visually stand out—noting that an artistic bus shelter may stand out more and be visually disruptive. Robert Morrissey suggested partnering with local schools to host an art contest for the bus shelters.

Melissa Orscheln asked if the Committee still aimed to partner with local businesses to fund artistic bus shelters. Alice Benner stated that yes, the goal was to increase public art in the city without cost to the city.

Lisa Hilton stated that her Metro contact said the west side of Olive is due for renovation in 2023. Now would be the time to think about a bus shelter at the boundary of Creve Coeur, or a piece of public art near the shelter welcoming people to Creve Coeur.
